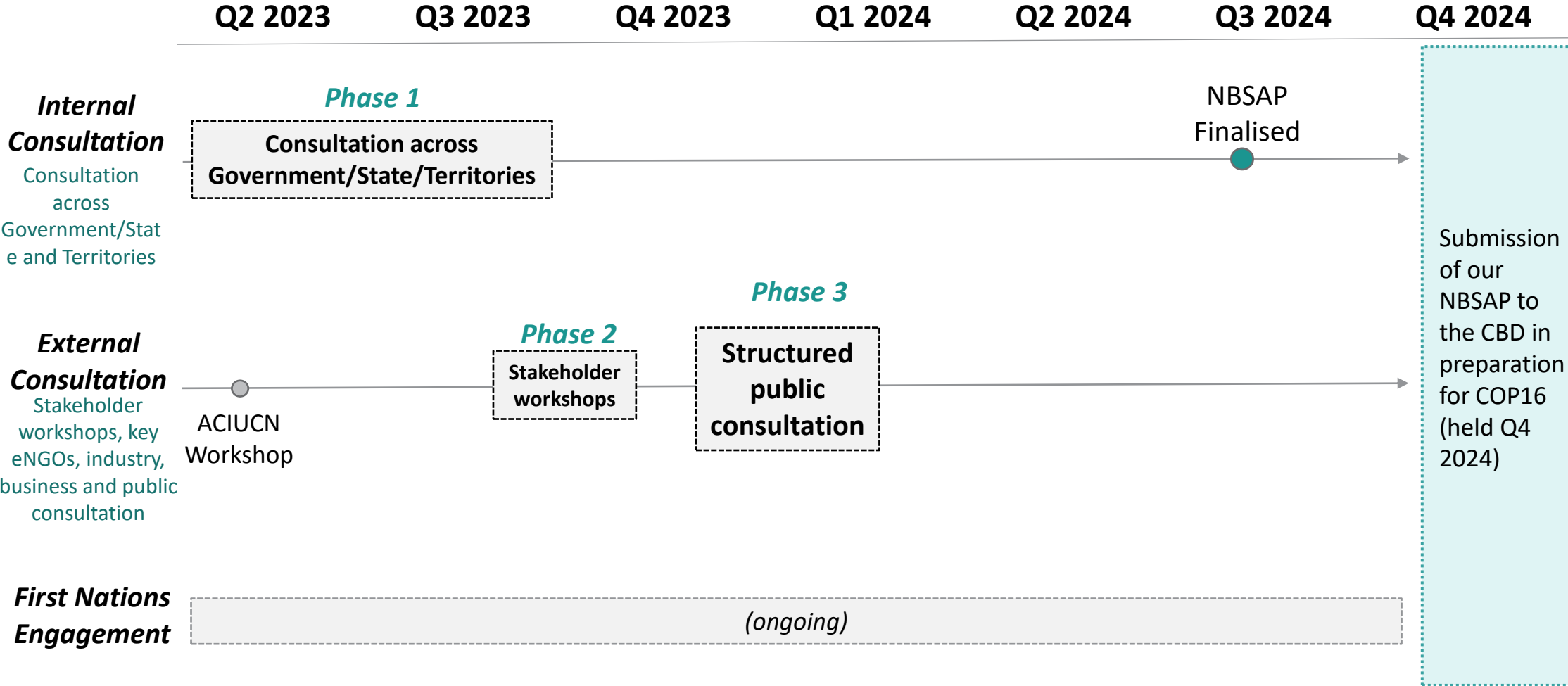

Existing commitments	Relevant GBF Target
Threatened Species Action Plan 2022-2032	Prevent new extinctions (Target 4) Better management of invasive species (Target 6)
Protect and conserve 30% of Australia's landmass and 30% of Australia's marine areas by 2030	Target 3
Exploring opportunities for strengthening marine protection	Target 3, 8
Establishing a nature repair market	Target 2,3, 14 and 18
National Waste Policy Action Plan	Target 7
