ABOUT THIS EVENT

Species Survival Symposium

2-4 July 2025 | Taronga Zoo, Sydney

This Symposium will bring together researchers, practitioners, First Nations people, Industry and Government representatives, and other experts and stakeholders in species conservation to tackle the challenges of halting extinctions and driving long-term species recovery.

In 2024, Australia's National Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan was updated to include 6 national targets to address the drivers of biodiversity decline. A key target is **No New Extinctions** and includes preventing new extinctions of native species, supporting the recovery of threatened species and maintaining genetic diversity.

Achieving this target will require more collaboration and support for biodiversity conservation, and a transformative shift to a nature-positive society.

Event Aims and Outcomes

- Share research, knowledge, and experience in species conservation across sectors, including industry.
- Explore innovative, collaborative and transformative approaches to remove threats, overcome barriers and conserve biodiversity
- Listen to First Nations experts, incorporate their perspectives, and support their leadership in healing Country
- Make recommendations for halting biodiversity loss and achieving genetically diverse, long-term species recovery in Australia.



EVENT HIGHLIGHTS

Attendance

The Taronga Zoo Institute of Science and Learning Theatre has a 235 seat capacity with room for another 5-10 people on the extra large stage and sidelines.

The event will also have use of 3 seminar rooms for another 90 people, and an open display area for gathering, eating, booths and banners. We will also be sharing a live video feed to virtual attendees.

We are expecting approximately 200 in-person attendees and 100 virtual attendees.
